Gross Anatomy Lab Rules and Regulations

Before you are given permission to work in the Gross Anatomy Lab, you must read and sign the following rules and regulations. You will be held responsible for your behavior and work in the Gross Anatomy Lab, as well as for any individuals you are responsible for. If you do not sign this document, you will not be granted unescorted access to the lab.

- 1. Proper attire is required to enter the Gross Anatomy Lab. You must wear closed-toe shoes. To participate in dissection, you must wear nitrile gloves, eye protection, a chemical-resistant apron and sleeve protectors. Face shields and/or surgical masks must be worn when observing operation of Stryker saws.
- 2. Food and beverages (opened or unopened) are prohibited in the lab.
- 3. Do not prop the door open. Securely close it behind you upon entering and exiting.
- 4. Do not provide entrance for any individual(s) not associated with your group.
- 5. Discussions of lab activities are to be discrete at all times, both in and out of the lab.
- 6. Under no circumstances are you allowed to tamper with materials, equipment or other instruments not assigned to you.
- 7. You are responsible for maintaining the condition of anatomical material, instruments and all other equipment assigned to you.
- 8. Your assigned station must be safe and clean at all times.
- 9. The recording of laboratory sessions or laboratory material in the Gross Anatomy Lab through photography, video, audio, phones, etc. is strictly prohibited. Never share photos, photos, videos, audio recordings and comments related to the gross anatomy lab via email, text messaging on social media sites like Facebook and Twitter, or anywhere else on the Internet.
- 10. Use headphones if you are listening to music.
- 11. Place all biohazardous material in red biohazard bags. This includes cadaver tissue and any other material comes in contact with any cadaver material. Nonbiohazardous materials can be placed in the grey and white trash bins. It is your responsibility to keep your work area clean and clear of debris.



12. Do not remove human remains, skeletal remains, models (plastic skeletons), plastinated materials, instruments or other teaching materials from the Gross Anatomy Lab.

Remember, permission to work in the Gross Anatomy Lab is considered a privilege and not a right. Be respectful of our donors at all times inside and outside of the lab.
